Eight and twentieth daie of April Anno Domini One thousand five hundred twentie
five And in the second yeare of the Reigne of our Sovereigne Lord Charles by the grace
of god King of England Scotland France and Ireland defender of the faith &c. I
Dorothea Calverley of London Widow being somewhat weak in body but of god and good
memory (I shalke be given to god) doe now revoke disannul and disallowe all former wills, testaments
and bequeaths by mee made at any tyme before the date hereof And doe make this to be my only last
will and testament as followeth, wherein I doe first bequeath my Soule into the hands of almighty
god my Creator And my body to the earth hoping and stedfastly believing by and thorough the merits
death, and passion of myne only Saviour and Redeemer Jesus Christ and by none other meane
to have full remission of all my sinnes and to see the lord in the land of the living And touching
the disposing of all such Temporall goods and Chattells as it hath pleased god to bestow upon me in
this life I give and dispose the same as followeth that is to say First I will that aswell the some of
fiftie poundes of lawfull money of England w^{ch} I doe acknowledge is by mee truly due and owing to
my Sonne in lawe Christopher Gibson as all other debts w^{ch} I shalke truly be indebted in to any person
or persons at the tyme of my decease shalke first paid and discharged and I doe here by give & bequeath
to my Sonne John Calverley five shillings for a legacy Item I doe give and bequeath to my
Daughter Ellen the wife of Roger Curvell my two dozen of laid worke napkins two laid worke
Covells and a table Cloth Item I give unto my Daughter Katherine Calverley the summe of
ten poundes of lawfull money of England w^{ch} said debt of fiftie poundes owing to my said
Sonne in lawe Christopher Gibson and all other the debts w^{ch} shalke by mee truly due and owing
at the tyme of my decease together w^{ch} the severall legacies before herein by mee given & bequeathed
and discharged out of the lease of my now dwelling house situate in the parish of St Michael
in Southhill London w^{ch} my will is shall after my decease be forth w^{ch} sold by my Executors
for the most money they maye conveniently make of the same, and that all such money as shalke
remayning of the money received or had by the sale of the same lease after the debts by mee
owing as aforesaid the legacies of my Sonne John and my Daughter Katherine and my funeral
charges shalke paid out of the same as aforesaid I will shalke equally divided betwixt fower of my
Daughters namely my said Daughter Curvell Elizabeth Walsen Widow Mary Calverley
and the before named Katherine Calverley part and part like that all the residue of my said goods

Chattells debts and household stuffe (after the legacie aforesaid here in by mee given to my daughter
 Ellen shall be paid) I will shall be equally divided and distributed betwixt all my five daughters
 namely Ellen Turvell Elizabeth Wilkinson Joire Gibson the wife of the before named Christopher
 Gibson Mary Salterly and Katherin Salterly part and part like And I doe here by ordaine and
 make my two daughters Ellen Turvell and Joire Gibson Executors of this my last will and Testament
 and last will desiring them to performe the same according to my true intencion before herein declared
 In witness whereof I the above named Dorothea Salterly have hereunto sett my hand & Seale
 Given the daie and yeare first above written The marke of the said Dorothea Salterly
 Sealed delivered and published by the above named Dorothea Salterly for and as her last will &

 Dorset Castle within the Isle of Purbeck in the Countie of Dorset being weak
 and sick in body but of sound and perfect memory (thanked be given to almighty god) doe
 make and ordaine this my last will and testam^t in manner and forme following first I
 commend my soule into the hands of almighty god my maker and Redeemer And my body unto the
 earth out of wh^{ch} it was taken to be buried in the Church of Dorset Castle aforesaid Item I give and
 bequeath towards the reparation of the same parish Church xx^s Item to the poore of the same parish
 to be by the Overseers of the poore distributed to the most needy poore of the same parish at the tyme
 of my funeralle Item I give and bequeath to the Churchwardens of the parish Church of Dorset
 Castle aforesaid and to their Successors Churchwardens for ever twenty and five poundes of lawfull
 English money the yearly profitt whereof I doe here by appoint to be yearly bestowed in bread
 and evey Sabbath yearly to be given to such poore of the said parish as the said Churchwardens
 and their Successors Churchwardens from tyme to tyme for the tyme being shall thinke fitt
 Item I give and bequeath unto Dina Miller my wife all my int^{ty} or tenement in Dorset
 Castle aforesaid with all and singular the appurtenances To hold the same unto her and her assignes
 during her life Item I give and bequeath unto Margery my daughter one hundred and twenty
 poundes to be paid her at her age of xxijth yeares or at the tyme of her marriage wh^{ch} shall first
 happen, of all wh^{ch} my pur^{ty}ose is that my said wife shall have the profitt towards the education and
 bringing up of my said daughter Item I give and bequeath unto my Sister Edyth Outler seven
 poundes of lawfull English money to be paid her yearly during her naturall life by) at the feast
 of St Michell Archangell old and at the feast of the annunciation of the blessed Virgin Mary
 old yearly as aforesaid And if it shall happen that Justice Tubbe shall die before Dina my wife
 then my will is and I doe further give and bequeath unto my said Sister Edyth Outler old by
 yeare more to be paid her halfe yearly as aforesaid from thenceforth during her life Item my
 further will is that if my wife shall die before my daughter then I hereby give and bequeath all my
 estate in my tenement at Wolqarston from and after her decease unto my said daughter Margery
 in Consideration whereof I doe hereby by gift and appoint my said daughter her Executor or assigne
 to hold and pay yearly unto my said Sister Edyth Outler the summe of twenty Shillings of lawfull
 English money payable as aforesaid Item if my said daughter shall happen to dye before her age of
