To All Christian people to Whome these presents shall Come Samuel Brooks of Easthampton in ye County of Suffolk on on Long Island Husbandman Sendeth Greeting yea that for divers good Causes and Considerations him ye sd Samuel Brooks thereunto moving but more Espesially for and in Consideration of a valuable sume unto herby Impowered by warrant from a Justis of ye peace to him paid by James Bird of ye same Town Husbandman hath Bargained & sold unto the aforesd James Bird all that his parsel of Land Laying in ye Northwest plaine in ye afore sd Easthampton bounded with ye Land of John Mulford and John Squier to ye westward to ye Northward with ye Land of Capt John Wheler: and with the Land of Beniamin Conkling to ye Southward and with ye Town High waye to ye Eastward Containing Eleven Acres be it more or Less To Have And to Hold forever and doth warrant And for ye sure per-
